ISRAEL JOINS UNITED NATIONS

The United Nations General Assembly, which chiped to create the State of Israel, now clocks her a member nation. Assembly President Evatt ennounces:

Although Britain abstained from voting, congratulations are showered on Israel's foreign Minister, Moche Sharett, from all the delegates. The yeung republic, born of war, now joins the council of peace. The blue-and-white Ster of David is added to the flags of the 58 other number states. Simultaneously with her admission to U.H.O., Fol-aviv (capital of Larael) colebrates the first emmiversary of the state's independence. Growds are so big that a giant parade has to be cancelled. In synagogues throughout the land, thousands of worshippers attend thanksgiving services. The day is declared an official heliday and, in Jerusalen, parades take place as scheduled.

The milling throngs keep their good spirits despite the crush. They salute the men and wemen who helped build a new democratic state.
