PRINCESS ELIZABETH UNVEILS GUNNERS MEMORIAL

Nine years to the day after the epic of Dunkirk, Britain pauses to remember. In London, at Hyde Park Corner, the men and women of the Royal Regiment of Artillery are joined by Princess Elizabeth as they pay homage to the gunners who died in the Second World War.

Unveiling a commemorative panel which has been added to the first world war memorial, the Princess says:-

"Everywhere - where duty and glory lead." To fulfil this motto, 29,000 Gunners died.

"Everywhere," the Gunners who fell will be remembered. Two hundred homes, which will house their widows and orphans, have been built as part of a memorial that will keep their sacrifice ever fresh in the nation's mind.
