Road racing, neglected in America since World War One, returns to Long Island where the famed Vanderbilt Oup races once reared over dusty roads. At Bridgehampben, a parade of turn of the century cars tees off a sporting event which mixes nostalgia and speed. Remember the days of the heeting Stanley Steemer ----

Fifteen thousand fans see the start of the feature race - a gruelling hundred mile test for fereign-wake sport cars. Ordinary country reads make up the four mile course. The unbanked turns are sharp and the skids are frequent.
