M.I. 5 CALLED ON TO INVESTIGATE DOCK DESPUTE

Docks. The Canadian ship "Beverbrae," which declars refuse to unlead due to a wage dispute between its Canadian crow and the emers, is cause of the trouble that now involves more than 8,000 men. Condensing the men's claim that the steppage is a lock-out engineered by the employers, Cabinet Ministers brand the strike as a Communist manceuvre. Dockland M.Ps, investigating the source of London's biggest held-up for years, are convined that it has been engineered for political metives. At meetings in Victoria Park, Union officials backed by M.Ps are unable to persuade the men to go back. The finding resulting from their investigations have been submitted to M.I.5, and the Home Secretary has been asked to hold a searching enquiry.

Vital experts are held up, while the dockers (in the words of one Minister) held the country to ransom. The cest of the dispute now nears half a million pounds.
