

INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW.

At White City, Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands leads the Dutch team's salute to the Queen, as the International Horse Show nears its close with the jumping finals.

In the Princess Elisabeth Cup - open to women riders of all nations - only two overseas competitors challenge. For the British team, the Countess of Dullay begins well, but her mount refuses at the third jump.

In the same event, "Eiblick" comes to grief.

Riding "Rusty" winner of last year's Dublin Show, is Miss Kellott, of Eire - technically, a "foreign" entrant. With next-to-no urging from his rider, "Rusty" makes a faultless round.

The Duchess of Beaufort presents Miss Kellott with the trophy. In the men's "King George the Fifth" Cup-competition, last year's winner, "Foxhunter" had Lt. Llewellyn in the saddle. But after a mishap at the parallel bars, fourth place is the best he can manage. Finally, the Queen presents the Cup to a young rider who took the 800-yard course without fault - Brian Butler. A great win for Britain.
