

YORKSHIRE'S ROYAL WEEK.

All Yorkshire turns out to greet its Royal visitors. At Huddersfield Football Ground, eight thousand schoolchildren and Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip paying their first joint visit to the Wool Capital of England.

Never has Huddersfield seen anything quite like it. Just as great a welcome awaits the Royal visitors at Wakefield - the agricultural centre of the West Riding. Walking along beflagged Head Street, they join, (outside the Town Hall) the Earl of Harewood, touring his home county with his cousin. Wakefield is at its best, and a delighted town - (its schoolchildren very much to the fore) - cheers itself hoarse, as the Princess comes out on the Town Hall balcony.

Earlier in the day, Leeds "Children's Day" Queen - 14-year-old Joan Thompson - led the welcome of the West Riding's capital to its Royal guests. Joan greets the Princess and the Duke at Roundhay Park, prior to a mass display by 5,500 Leeds youngsters.

As the Royal party leaves, Yorkshire's big week draws to a close, and 50,000 Leeds folk make it an occasion they'll never forget.
