BOY AMBASSADORS TOUR CANADA

Canada welcomes 50 British boys to a month's tour of the Dominion. All are students and apprentices between 14 and 17 - chosen from boys clubs throughout Britain. At Toronto, Acting-Mayer John Innes leads an official greeting. Idea behind the tour is that one-good-look is worth a hundred text-books. First stop is Toronto University, prelude to a coast-to-coast tour. Half the boys are from Macclesfield, former constituency of industrialist Garfield Weston who sponsored the trip to promote closer relations between Britain and Canada.
