

ARMY BOYS FREEZE IN 'FRIG.

Outside the Canadian National Research Council laboratories in Ottawa the thermometer registers 96 degrees - but what a difference inside! To test equipment, hardy Canadian soldiers go on an Arctic expedition in the "Cold Room." Man-made snowdrifts go into the coffee. At a temperature of 70 below zero (a hundred-and-fifty-six degrees cooler than outside) these snowmen want to get hot inside, inside. The coffee doesn't stay hot very long. But it certainly tastes good - down to the last ice-cream.
