QUEEN LAUDS SCOTTISH EXHIBITION

At Kelvin Hall, Glasgow, Scotland lays out her shop window to the world. To open the ambitious Scottish Industries Exhibition comes the Queen, who breaks her holiday at Balmoral to attend this Royal occasion. Received by the Lord Provost, the Queen gets a rousing Glasgow welcome from the thousands crowded along Argyle Street.

Accompanied by Princess Margaret, the Queen faces a glittering assembly for the opening ceremony. Scottish industry (and the Scottish Council, who promoted the exhibition) regard the Queen's presence as a significant honour, for it is the first time that she has opened a trade fair.

Amid a spectacular setting, more than 300 manufacturers are exhibiting Scotland's quality goods in this, the largest industrial fair ever held north of the Border. To their old and famous products that have brought "Made in Scotland" many honours the Scots have added new enterprises. Today it's not only Scotch, but hundreds of other newly established industries that take the Scottish label round the world. Scotland can make it - in industries as varied as her workers are versatile.
