AUSTRALIAN FLOODS MAKE 6.000 HOMELESS.

For the second time in three months, floods ravage the Northern Coast of New South Wales. 200 square miles of Amstralia's richest dairy farming area lie submerged. Devastated by the swirling waters is the town of Hampsey, where the River Hasleey rose 5 feet in one afternoon. Stock losses are set at 23 million. More than 15,000 cattle are drowned. Hundreds of rotting carcasses litter the countryside. The loss in dairy eattle may bring a reduction in butter experts to Britain. Once thriving Kampsey is now mething but mud and wreckage. 15 people are known to have been killed. Hundreds more are missing. Six thousand are hemeless. 103096-C

As the waters recode, Kempsey takes stock. The Australian Government have given \$40,000 for relief work, but with the demage set in millions of pounds, it is left to the people in this disaster area to fend for themselves. Like their forefathers - who wrested these homes from the wilderness they will start anew.
