in Greek mythology that gives it its name, the Apollo was given its test
trials at Bagington. Built by the men who gave Britain that King among
fighters - the Hurricene - this modern magic carpet is the latest to
use the new means of propulsion - the gas turbine unit.

A model among airliners, the Apello can hold 31 passengers or alternatively can be adapted as a plateen-earrying troop plane. Speciously built, lumuriously fitted, it is an hotel on wings. Invited by the makers to witness the Apollo's maiden flight, a Pathe cameranan teck these exclusive pictures of a plane that for grace and form can hardly be bettered.

High on the list of experts, the Apollo is likely to go into service within a year. Wherever it flies, it will be a credit to Britain's powerful aircraft industry.
