CLAYTON GAME BUT FAMECHON EASY WINNER

In a twenty-foot square at Manchester's Belle Vue, the European featherweight title hangs in the balance. On your right, square-shouldered Ray Famechon - the French holder. His opponent - tousle-haired Ronnie Clayton - champion of Britain and idol of Lancashire. They've met twice before and both times, Famechon was the winner. For 26-year-old Clayton, it's third time unlucky - for the Frenchman is on top all the way and never lets up. Not even Clayton's grandstand finish can save him the fight. Clear winner on points and firmly enthroned as European featherweight King is Ray Famechon - the champion from France.

And now for a champion in the making! His head covered in the manner of his ancestors, he fights with the fury of a demon. It's a Cherokee Indian, Earl Walls, from Canada - already hailed as a successor to Joe Louis. Pounding his dark skinned French opponent - Albert Coulbaly into submission, the 21-year-old Canadian scores his fourth first-round triumph in Britain. The Frenchman, hopelessly outclassed, never has a chance against this lethal attack.

It's taken Walls only just over 100 seconds to send his well-built opponent into the land of dreams. If he keeps this form there's a World championship for Earl Walls.
