

LOST LEGION RETURNS TO GERMANY

A lost legion comes home to Germany. A stretcher - bearing a legless cripple - is among the 150,000 German prisoners-of-war who have returned from Soviet Russia. Relatives are there to greet them. Many have been away nine years - ever since that June day, when they set out to pillage and plunder a country with whom they had a pact of non-aggression. Little did they dream that this was to be their fate. More than two hundred women are among the homecomers. They are Germans who lived in East Prussia - now Soviet territory.

No sympathy need be wasted on these men. Greeted by a new deal (money, food and clothes) it remains to be seen whether they've grasped a new ideal. Memories are short, but before society again accepts these men, they must prove themselves worthy.
