ENGLAND REAT FRANCE AT BORDEAUX

England hit back in a storwing rally. First, new bey Ken Traill puts them shead and, soon after, Ken Gee makes the issue safe. To round off a fine performance, Ward converts, to give England victory by 13 to 5.
