Fifty-thousand sightseers expect thrills when the Yerkshire Aeroplane Glub stages the International Jet Air Rase. Earl Searberough welcomes the word Mayor of cooks just in time for the take-off. There's the Vampire flown by John Derry, with Lucky Lithgew's Attacker and Zura-kowaki's Meteor close behind. Wimmy Wade's Seahawk roars after them. And with it, here's the Hybrid meter-cycle. Tough, easily controlled and with a tep speed of 65, it's ideal for training. Low centre of gravity and high clearence gives good climbing over difficult ground. For the experts, it's a vertical twin developing 16HHP - whatever that means. Anyway, it looks as though the Army has two first-class recruits.

It's the final of the speedbeat Geld Cup and the 8 starters include Sle-Me-Shum, which set a record Compbell couldn't beat.

There goes Slo-Mo-Shun and close on her heels Guy Lombarde's Tempe 6.

New it's a race between Tempo 6 and Sle-Me-Sham, but the record breaker roars ahead to win with a perfect score.

Britain builds the world's first enti-submarine plane - The Fairey 17 - with two engines in one. Garry Spink helped to design her. Gordon Slade tries her out. Wings that feld mechanically to ene-third their normal spread ensure speedy stowing under battle conditions. Successful deck-landing trials have been completed on board H.M.S. Illustrious.

Double-propellers, driven by Armstrong-Whitworth Turbe-Jet engines, can run either as a team or separately, making for safety if one engine outs out, and fuel economy with great cruising range. Her builders hope she's the final counter to the menace of the submarine. Guided by radar, she can track down and kill her enemy by day or night.
