

KEY TO KOREA

This is Pusan, prize in the battle for Korea. For the first time since the start of "red aggression, newreel pictures are permitted of the great port on whose security depends the striking power - the very existence - of United Nations troops in Korea." Into this key port sail men of the first Marine Division - the famous leathernecks. Four weeks ago, they were in San Francisco. Within twelve hours they will be in battle, commanded by Brigadier Edward Craig, on the right.

Rocket-firing planes of the fifth Air Force strafe advanced units of twelve enemy divisions probing for weak spots across the Naktong River.

In defense of Pusan, a flank offensive is planned by General Walton Walker, and soldiers and marines launch the first successful advance of the campaign.

The build-up starts to show results. For the first time, the invaders feel the weight of a United Nations attack.
