BRUSSELS

To troubled Belgium comes a promise of stability, as nineteen-year-old Prince Baudouin arrives at the House of Representatives in Brussels to take over the Royal prerogatives yielded by his father, Leopold the Second. Waiting for him to take the oath, eight hundred senators are startled when a communist deputy interrupts.

The disturbance brings members to their feet in spontaneous sympathy for the young Prince, until order is restored by Monsieur van Cauwelaert, President of the House, who asks the Prince to proceed.

NANCY

In the fortress town of Nancy, in Lorraine, Mr. Churchill gazes out on the crowd in front of Marshal Foch's old headquarters as the citizens prepare to do him honour.

Wearing only one decoration - the Medaille Militaire - he becomes a Freeman of Nancy. With his name already on the scrolls of Strasbourg and Metz, he unites in his person the ideals of a United Europe.
