WORLD NEWS

NEW YORK

Foreign Secretary Bevin, Dean Acheson and Schuman of France meet for a short discussion before the opening of the Big Three Conference on Western Defence to be held at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel.

In Conference, experts advise the Ministers in their discussions. Acheson puts America's views and can tell Bevin and Schuman how much America can help to strengthen West European defences. Tied in with this is the question of re-arming West Germany. It's a vital meeting but no big decisions are expected immediately.

BERLIN

In the forecourt of the Plotsensee prison, Mayer Reuter honours the memory of the men who tried to free Germany from Hitler on July 20th, 1944. The bomb plot, in which generals and other high officials were involved, failed. Hitler was barely injured, but took fiendish revenge on the conspirators. And here (where West Germany honours them as patriots and resistance leaders), at Hitler's orders, they were hanged on butchers' hooks.

KANSAS

Stepping up the world's largest bomber - the B.36 - America adds four jet engines for a spurt to over 430 miles-an-hour over the target. For short runs she can carry 42 tons. On her six ordinary engines she can cruise ten thousand miles at heights considered well beyond effective fighter interception.

BLACKPOOL

After dark, Lancashire's favourite resort becomes a black - pool of light. It's the illuminations and everybody's welcome who prefers the Blackpool prom. to the Albert Hall kind.
