Dec. by the representatives of Cuba, Ecuador, France, Norway, the United Kingdom and the United States - should now be put to the vote'.
39. L.M.S. 'Far from seeking profitable concessions for trusts and monopolies in Korea we were only too conscious, the British people, that we'll have to make very heavy sacrifices for their reconstruction and rehabilitation of Korean autonomy.'
40. M.S. 'Now Mr. President, after this general statement of the position of my delegation it will be clear why we still urge the Security Council to adopt by a large, by an overwhelming majority I should hope, the resolution on Korea which is before it and to which I have referred. The matter must be settled peacefully and it is clear that there is little prospect of doing this so long as one of the parties concerned and that is the Central Peoples Government of the Republic of China is engaged in large-scale military operations against United Nations forces and in defiance of the express will of the United Nations. And so Mr. President, I revert to my original proposal that the pending

resolution of Item 2A of our present agenda now be put to the vote. If it is vetoed we shall then have to consider what to do next.
