It is clear that that will need some very serious reflection but I still have hope that the Chinese Peoples Government, in view of what I and others have said, will in effect pay attention to what is said in the draft resolution and indicate that in principle they are prepared to agree that the whole problem of Korea can at least be solved in accordance with the principles of the international organisation, which, I believe, they are so keen to enter.
