

STOCKHOLMBRITISH NOBEL PRIZE WINNERS

On the 50th anniversary of the Nobel Foundation King Gustav and Queen Louise of Sweden arrive for the presentation of the Nobel prizes to eight winners. These are awarded each year from the income of a fund established by the Swedish inventor, Alfred Nobel. Awards are made by Sweden and Norway. Dr. Bunch who won the Peace prize received his award in Oslo.

To Professor Cecil Powell of Bristol University, King Gustav presents the prize for physics.

Lord Russell, better known as Bertrand Russell, philosopher and well-known broadcaster, receives the award for literature in which, as the citation reads, 'he has shown himself an apostle of humanity and freedom of thought.' The Nobel Prizes, greatest of which is the Peace Prize, are the bequest of the man who invented dynamite.
