

AIR GIANTS FROM U.S.

The world's biggest bombers visit Britain as six American B.36s look in at Lakenheath for a short visit. Twin jets are for take-offs and spurring over the target area. Spare engines are carried. With all ten engines flat out nearly 450-miles-an-hour is top speed.
