

GIANT BOMBERS RETURN TO U.S.

It's 'Goodbye' to the B.36s as the crews mount the ladder in the nose-wheel housing, their short visit from Texas over. With them, the giant bombers brought their own service crews and supplies, and they, too, are packing up in the Flying Boxcar that brought them. Huge transport planes like this have done a wonderful job in Korea because of the weight they can carry and the ease of loading. All aboard! It's time for the big bombers to start up.

As they take off wing-tip smoke shows the four jet engines helping the six ordinary piston engines.

Just a year after the prototype was built, the first B.36s were coming off the production line. They're the world's biggest and most powerful bombers. So far, it's believed, fifty are in service, built in the last three years. These giant bombers can strike anywhere, swiftly and powerfully, and that should discourage aggressors.
