

WAR ORPHANS FIND REFUGE

To Cheju Island, fifty miles off the southern tip of Korea, landing craft bring refugees of war. Seventy thousand have arrived to date (so many of them orphans) that it is now called Orphans' Island. And more arrive every day. Their home is a former agricultural college. Here, except for medicines, there's a shortage of everything - clothes, bedding, even spoons. And the youngsters have to take turns eating, waiting for the few spoons to make the rounds.

So many youngsters need shelter that they live, eat, sleep and play crowded eighty into one room. But at least they're safe and cared for. And Cheju Island, once a base for war (for it was from here that Ghengis Khan set out to try to conquer Japan) is now an island of peace.
