81 KILLED IN TRAIN WRECK

the Breker, the crack businessman's express crashed down a 26-foot embankment at Weedbridge, 24 miles out of New York. Owing to cancellations on other lines due to a strike, the 11-ceach train was evererewied, its corridors packed with those returning from work. As it crossed a temperary treatle bridge the train mobbled, the engine reared like a horse and (with eight coaches) whipped down the steep embankment. From the twisted wreekage rescue workers bring out the injured and dead under the fierce glare of are-lights.

Oxy-acetylene torches blase as the steel coaches are out open to rescue the trapped. To reach ethers, fire escape ladders have to be called into action. The accident happened on a temperary by-pass line put into use only the day before whilst a new bridge is being built on the usual route.

It's the worst railread accident in New Jersey's history and the third big wreck on the New York lines this year.
