HONOURS FOR DANISH KING

From Windsor Castle the Garter Knights march in procession. Following Princess Elizabeth and the Duke is King Frederik, newly invested and now to be installed by the King. Mantled in blue, their Tudor hats decked with ostrich and heron feathers, they go to St. Georges Chapel - Alankrooke, Portal, Mountbatten. But in all there are no more than 25 (other than the Royal family) in this our most exclusive order of chivalry. In St. Georges, chapel of the order, the King will appoint the new knight companion to a stall and his installation will be complete.

Next, at the Guildhall, King Frederik is to be honoured by the City of London. Princess Elizabeth is with the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress and overhead flies the Danish flag, as King Frederik and Queen Ingrid arrive.

In the library of the Court of Common council, escorted by the senior alderman, their Majesties move towards scarlet thrones at the head of the hall, past the court of common council with their wands of office and robes of deep blue.

In the basket is the city's address of welcome, which the Lord Mayor will present to the King.

After a tribute to London's past and her friendship and commerce with Denmark, King Frederik says:
