The good ship "Centurion" heads for Lambeth Pier and the centuries roll back. Two-hundred-and-fifty years ago a "Centurion" took the first missionary to Boston, America. Today, the Archbishop of Canterbury comes to bless the new "Centurion," replica of the old, which will tour our coasts, carrying on the work of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel.
