

BRITISH WIN AT LE MANS

The signal's given and drivers of six nations race to their cars at the start of the world's most grueling race. And here comes Sterling Moss in a Jaguar making a quick getaway for the Le Mans 24-hours Grand Prix, for sports cars. It's "flat out" day and night, with 63 cars fighting for the most coveted award in the racing world.

Here's Peter Walker in his Jaguar. The speed's terrific and already records are being broken. Sterling Moss in another Jaguar has lapped at about 106-miles-an-hour, and the Aston-Martins are surprising everybody.

Through the night the 63-lap the eight-and-a-half-miles circuit, with Walker holding a good lead.

Daylight reveals the casualties of the night with Walker still leading. He's averaging over 93-miles-an-hour, and the first British win at Le Mans since 1935 is in the bag as he elicits to the final stretch leading by nine laps.

2,244 miles in 24 hours! It's a brilliant triumph for Peter Walker and his co-driver Peter Whitehead.
