As the world's most greelling eyele race nears the end of its 2,900 miles course, it's Fausto Coppi, 1949 winner, about to pass Buchemet of France and win the 20th stage, to pick up about £100. This is Bobet. Next day, the field heads for Aix-lee-Bains. Twenty-three entrants from seven nations started for the £15,000 prine, but some fell by the myside. Twice a winner is Bartali of Italy - a veteran new, but going well.

Two mimstes sheed of the field, Gauthier of France battles with Pessi of Italy as they climb for the Col de Porte. Pessi falters and Gauthier tales the lead.

But here comes Ruis of Spain to storm past Gauthier and win the day's prise.

But Koblet of Switzerland is well shead on aggregate time, and wearing the yellow sweater of leadership, he goes on to win the Tour.
