### NEW RIFLE TEST FOR EXPERTS.

The School of Infantry, Warminster, becomes the centre of world-military interest as Empire and foreign experts see a vital small-arms demonstration. Here's the American Garrand semi-automatic, firing 45 aimed shots in a minute.

Next, the British Army's old stand-by, the 303 Lee-Enfield with 27 shots.

And here's the one they're up against - the new British 280. It looks strange, but it's lighter and handier than any other rifle. Note the optical sight, and the grenade-shaped left-hand grip. It's so simple that training is easy, though it's not much use for squad drill!

84 a minute is the 280's rate - and all in the target. The only snag is that the smaller ammo means altering all production plants. But this is what it does to tin hats at 600 yards! The new 280 machine-gun's just as revolutionary. Compare it with the familiar water-cooled Vickers. A good, hard-hitting weapon, the Vickers is heavy and cumbersome. The new type, air-cooled and lighter, is still experimental but very promising!

Meantime, the new rifle's been put through an artificial sand-storm. Here she is, all covered in sand, enough to put any rifle out of action. But not this baby! Press a button and it becomes a machine-gun.
