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JANAICA HURFICANE

Realing in the wake of the worst hurricene in its history, Jamaica grinly counts the cost. Sweeping great ships from their meerings and sinking small ones, the storm weeked all in its path. Palisadoes Airport, at Kingston - the island's capital - is a heap of ruins ... and mearby on the Airport Read a huge freighter lies aground.

The driver left his ear just before this tree fell. 150 peeple lost their lives in the disaster. From the stripped goods sheds food is rushed to feed the 20,000 left homeless by the 125-miles-en-hour storm. At Port Boyal only six houses remain standing. It is here in the old pirate city that 70 convicts escaped when a prisen will collapsed. Another seene of devastation is the Chinese Hospital and in nearby homes search continues for the missing. Damage amounts to more than twentymillion-peends. Britain has already sent a guarter-of-e-million for immediate needs; but with its power, to kephenes and water supply disrupted, its crops virtually destroyed, Janaica desperately meds all the help that can be given.
