From Abadan British staff recalled when the cilfields were start down and taken over by the Persians begin the first stage of their journey back to England as they cross the Shatt-el-Arab to the Angle-Iranian administrative effices at Kerramshahr. ## Sagramento, Calif.

Galifornian youngsters find a new thrill in their young lives in the form of a toys lending-library. Starting with simple toys (which must be returned in good cendition) they qualify for better ones each week. The toys are old ones repaired and repainted at a nearby prison, and they're sterilised after each lending. Girls who take good care of the dolls they berrow are allowed to keep them; and little beys who want to take care of themselves can also be accommodated. For youngsters who have no toys of their own, the toy library is the answer to their wildest dreams.
