

## THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF NURSING EDUCATIONAL FUND

COUNTESS MOUNTBATTEN'S APPEAL

At the Warner Theatre on Saturday, 22nd. September, their Royal Highnesses The Princess Elizabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh will attend the World Premiere of "THE LADY WITH A LAMP", the film which tells the story of Florence Nightingale. It stars Anna Neagle and Michael Wilding. The entire proceeds will be given to the Royal College of Nursing Educational Fund.
