If this purpose is to be achieved, there is to be no subservience in class or privilage at home and no reflexion from our known and agreed pelicy of acting with the other free democracies with strength, patience and firmness.

So far as the Conservative party is concerned, our whole offort will be directed towards national recovery both at home and abread and we recognize that cannot be done without a very considerable measure of goodwill from the great majority of the people.

Free ourselves from Socialist rule then to stand crect once more to take place among the great powers of the world. Never shall we lose our faith and courage. Mever shall we fail in exertion and resolve."
