CHURCHILL'S TORY MESSAGE

A huge crowd welcomes Mr. Churchill to Liverpool as he comes to launch the Conservative election campaign at the Liverpool Stadium which is in the heart of Mrs. Braddeek's Exchange Division.

To his audience of fourteen-thousand this was the crux of Mr. Churchill's message:-

"We need four or five years of calm, resolute policy and administration to enable us, after we have been through, to re-gather our inherent strength and allow our native qualities to shine forth and earn their reward. This will be no vindictive triumph for Tories over Socialists, no dull exclusion of Liberal and independent forces, but rather a period of healing and revival. If this purpose is to be achieved, there is to be no subservience in class or privilege at home and no reflexion from our known and agreed policy of acting with the other free democracies with strength, patience and firmness.

So far as the Conservative party is concerned, our whole effort will be directed towards national recovery both at home and abroad and we recognise that cannot be done without a very considerable measure of goodwill from the great majority of the people.

Free ourselves from Socialist rule then to stand erect once more to take place among the great powers of the world. Never shall we lose our faith and courage. Never shall we fail in exertion and resolve."
