

ARRIVAL AT MONTREAL

Landing at Dorval airport ahead of schedule, the strato-cruiser CANOPUS completes her 3,000 miles flight from London. The Guard of Honour comes to attention and a great cheer greets Princess Elisabeth and the Duke of Edinburgh as they disembark.

As Governor-General, Field Marshal Lord Alexander, is first to extend Canada's welcome; and then M. St. Laurent, the Prime Minister.

Now the Princess walks to a platform where the 60,000 crowd can see her as her standard flies for the first time on Canadian soil. Next, escorted by Fl.Lt. Roy, she inspects the 100-strong Guard of Honour mounted by the Royal Canadian Air Force.

Then, before leaving the airport, the royal couple say farewell to the crew of CANOPUS - starting with Captain Jones. The Princess, incidentally, is Grand Master of the Guild of Pilots.

Now it's time to drive to a little siding and board the royal train which is to take them to Quebec where the tour proper begins. During their visit they'll cover 18,000 miles - seven thousand more than the King and Queen did in 1939.

As Princess Elisabeth and the Duke board the 10-coach train which will be their home for much of the trip, the rain-drenched but happy crowd fairly lets itself go. There's no doubt about Canada's welcome and it must have been a thrilled Princess who telephoned to London a few hours later to report All's Well!
