VOLCANO DISASTER

For the third time in four years Mount Hebe-Hebe on Campigan island in the Philippines is in violent eruption. Vast rivers of lava stream down the side of the volcano engulfing all in its path. In the first unexpected explosion at least 2,000 people were buried alive, in and around Mambajae at the volcane's feet. Refugees flee the island's largest town as five explosions occur in three days. Now the evacuation of the whole 65,000 population of the island has been ordered. Meanwhile, old and young heave by beat for the larger island of Mindaneo.

Makeshift hospitals are opened up - with nurses and supplies flown in from 400 miles away.

This is a field of lave - melten stone still smeking and smouldering days after it came down the mountain.

Here smong the coconut palms was a village. It's flimmy buts disappeared in flame, and with them the people within. And above the wreelage, Hebe-Hebe still smokes and threatens.
