But France came back to this challenge and their captain Basquet barged through to scere a try which Jean Prat converted. But within two minutes Scotland again made it anyone's game. Fulton received and passed on to Davidson. From Davidson the ball went to Cordial who broke through to score a grand try.

Thomsen converted but that was the end of scering and France won by 13 to 11.
