- 1. L.V. Elevated, Churchill being escorted up to Speaker's rostrum. 7'
- 2. S.V. Mrs. Truman with daughter and other dignitaries applauding from balcony. 3'
- 3. L.V. Churchill standing at rostrum. 5'
- 4. S.V. Mr. Churchill speaking, he says: "I have not come here to ask you for money (Applause). 14'
- 5. S.C.U. "To ask you for money to make life more comfortable, or easier for us in Britain (laughter). However, our standards of life are our own business and we can only keep our self-respect and independence by looking after them ourselves." 33'
- 6. C.U. "That is why I have come here to ask not for gold but for steel, not for favours but equipment. That is why many of our requests have been so well and generously met." 28'
- 7. C.U. Cut-in (4'). "The sooner strong enough forces can be assembled in Europe under United command, the more effective will be the deterrent (G.V). against a third World war. If I may say this, Members of Congress, be careful above all things not to let go the atomic weapon until you are sure, and more than sure, that other means of preserving peace are in your hands." (Applause). 50'
