In Tunisia, three constables were killed when a crowd stormed police headquarters at Moknine in a burst of nationalist agitation. Order restored, police carried out a vigorous search for terrorists. The trouble seems linked with the spread of nationalist feeling throughout North Africa. Once again, fanatics intervene and make matters worse.

Sarawak

In faraway Borneo, Britain honours a bush tracker named Awang for conspicuous gallantry in Malaya. The Governor of Sarawak reads the citation and Awang walks up to receive the George Cross, the civilian V.C. While helping our troops fighting in Malaya, he saved a severely wounded British soldier and dragged him to safety though himself wounded and under heavy fire.

Washington

From the National Airport, President Truman sets off for an inspection flight over the Midwest area inundated by the flooding of the Ohio River. Transferring later to an Army plane Mr. Truman makes a four-hour flight over Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio and Kentucky. Besides twenty-million dollars damage the flood leaves nine-thousand homeless and ten dead. Near zero weather adds further difficulties in this large stricken area.
