Funerals of three French Gendarmes of the Police forces who found their death in the latest terrorist attacks around Tunis. In the cortege are, families of Brigadier J. CARDI, Policeguard MADELINE and Policeguard CALMES, as well as french officials :

-Commandant BARRAS-PERRIER

Mr. ROBERT General Director of Security forces

-Mr. BARTHOUERY, of the Police Forces

-Commandant PETIGAS, Chief of Police-Guards dispatched in Tunisia

The funerals go along the streets of the Arabian town showing silent crowd standing without sign or word, and then through the European town, before stopping at the Cathedral and going on to the French graveyard.

Following the order of general strike; the Central market in Tunis is entirely devoid of goods, besides small amounts of vegetables sold by Tunisian Veterans wearing brassards showing they were in the war beside French Forces.

Searches are made in the Arabian Town for guerilleros and terrorists, and arms as well as known terrorists are found.

Otherwise all is quiet in the town which seems to have returned to near-normal life.
