

ALTWEGG WINS OLYMPIC SKATING TITLE

It's the Men's Slalom race in the Winter Olympic Games near Oslo on a really tough course that has a 40-degree slope in parts - and here's Zeno Colo of Italy who won the down-hill ski race.

Hans Senger, wearing unlucky 13, goes astray and has to reverse.

Now it's Toni Spiess. Owing to light snow, the course is rough in places - and Spiess has found a bad spot - he's down and sliding down the steep track...but here comes the rescue squad - no, pardon me, it's the Americans starting in the 4-man bob heats. This must be one of the most thrilling of all sports. The Yanks are up against tough opposition from this German crew who are favourites.

The Germans win the heat and look set for their second Gold Medal, but it looks as though someone just didn't like the way somebody put on the brakes!

At the Bisset Stadium, Jeanette Altwegg is all set to win the first Gold Medal for Britain. 21-year-old champion of Britain, Europe and the world, she's just finishing her exhibition.

And Jeanette wins by more than two points. Now she says she's going to retire from international competition and just skate for pleasure.
