CORONATION AND PRIZES

At the end of the contest the winner will be crowned Britain's Ballroom Queen for 1952 by Cesar Romero, who will also present the prizes.

The winner of the title will receive "The People" National Ballroom Queen Challenge Trophy and a purchase voucher for £100. She will also win a special holiday for two, a week-end's entertainment in London for two, and a number of valuable gifts some of which have been donated by leading manufacturers.

JUDGING THE CONTEST

The judging will be done by two panels under the chairmanship of Mr. P.J.S. Richardson, O.B.E., Chairman of the Official Board of Ballroom Dancing.

The judging of charm will take place at a series of private interviews before the public proceedings begin.

Beauty and grace will be judged as the competitors walk slowly across the ballroom floor and curtsy to the judges.

HOW THEY QUALIFIED

Some 10,000 girls have competed for the 1952 title, entering the preliminary Contests held last Summer at seaside resorts all round Britain's coast, and during the Autumn at over a hundred cities and towns throughout Britain. Any girl between the ages of 16 and 30 was entitled to compete, providing she was of British nationality and an amateur dancer as defined by the Official Board of Ballroom Dancing.

First and second prize-winners were invited to compete in twelve Λ rea Finals early this year. The 24 Grand Finalists are the winners and runners-up at these Λ rea Finals.

In every stage of the contest, beauty, grace and charm as well as dancing ability has been taken into account.

SPECIAL BALLROOM GOWNS

Each of the Grand Finalists won as part of her prize at the Area Finals a new ballroom gown, individually designed and created for her by the Mayfair fashion house of Roecliff and Chapman. These gowns will be worn by all the contestants at Grosvenor House.

Beauty specialists from Max Factor (Hollywood) will be in attendance on the Grand Finalists.

During the evening a new formation dancing contest will also be held.
