

"IKE'S" GOODBYE TO FRENCH ARMY

Continuing his farewell tour of Europe's capitals, General Eisenhower visits the French Army of Occupation in Germany. With their colours borne by men dressed in Napoleonic uniforms, the French pay tribute to their friend who soon must leave to join battle again - this time for the presidency of the United States.

The General had called on his former enemies in Bonn the day before this visit and lunched with the German Chancellor, Doctor Adenauer. Now, in Coblenz, he is saluted both as a great soldier and a comrade by those with whom he brought victory in Europe.
