Briefly this show has been running since 1831, and never in all these years has a greater sensation hit the public than this year. (Unlike G.B. where the public have so many diverse interests, there is practically no section of the population in the 32 Counties that the show does not interest or affect in some way. Not to "do the show" is a social solecism.)

Show opened on usual note in which "Foot and Mouth in Jersey & G.B." took only second place but a short head, to the speakers own particular interest in the show.

But on Wednesday evening the main topic of conversation in Ireland was the rumour that a "foot & mouth" contact, was in the R.D.S.

Special precautions had been taken (see "Times" 6/5/52 section ① - But someone had "slipped the net" — in fact the Supreme Grand Champion of Jersey MIGHT be a contact via Mr Stephen Berchard etc - See "Times" 8/5/52. and owner Mr Benson was served with not to remove animal. and 1000 animals were impounded. Intensified spraying, soaked mats, soaked sand - with disinfectant followed. Cattle removed from public view or contact and prizel parades cancelled. See News papers for balance. Can 4 shots in Agre. machine  
Paddock. taken from top of  
a grain elevator and may be a  
bit swaying - (it was very breezy  
see flags waving). This can  
finishes on more shots of kiddies  
from class 105 above.

Can 5. "foot & mouth" precautions  
- a gumpf stood right in front  
of camera on the pan as it was

finishing - so have a close up of feet and spraying waggles etc for a cut before a tilt shot up to "prohibition notice" - This may save it. 45 ft above. Balance of 55 ft on this can was the International jumping competition "K" won by Lt. Col. H. Llewellyn wearing "hunting pink" on the famous horse FOXHUNTER. Shot 20 ft or so on him. It follows a brief shot of a British Army officer clearing a jump. Next 20 ft odd shot is of the Irish hope C. J. H. Dudgeon (riding in Black hat and green velvet - He rode Sea Spray but was not mapped - I think he "raps" the last jump in the shot. See Think I ran out on Llewellyn receiving his purple rosette. Blue programme. Can 6 is some 60 - 70 ft on Ballyboys House (pron. the Bal as in Ballet).

We see farmers approaching a Civic Guard (policeman) on duty to stop ingress of strangers etc. and a sprayer guard, spraying the ground at entrance gates. Through gate in distance is "the bull who nearly stopped the Show" — followed by '6" shot of the bull.
