On the mountainous and rocky river COUZE CHAMBON in central mountains, Auvergne, the Annual competition for Kayaks and Canadian crafts, one and or two places is opened. The race goes on a 5 km.200 length with a difference of altitude of 20 per 1000. Numerous and dangerous difficulties are along the course, and skilled as well as nerve are necessary to take part in this competition.

There is no general classification, but one for every category of crafts.

For the KAYAKS, <sup>63</sup>ZUBIRI realized the best time, covering the 5 Kms 200 in 26 minutes 26<sup>3</sup>/<sub>5</sub>, while the second DOLOR<sup>63</sup> realized 2 minutes more, and the third KIENE(Nr.52) ~~is~~ even a few seconds more. Zubiri is already recordman for crossing the Channel in his Kayak.
