U.S. MARINES IN ATOM TEST

At Yucca Plat, Nevada, +U.S. Marines prepare for their first taste of atomic warfare, three miles from the blast centre.

Tracer rockets go up first, then the blast takes place in an unearthly silence. A huge solid column of dust is sucked up because of the low point of explosion. It will be some seconds yet before the sound and shock waves reach the Marines.

Now the Marines close in towards the explosion area with its towards menacing column, and America's 28th atomic bomb test comes to its conclusion.

On Yucca Plat, Nevada, United States Marines prepare for their first taste of atomi- warfare. The troops, in foxholes three taster miles from the center of the blast, will be closer than any other troops in history.

The tracer rockets go up first, then the blast takes place in an eerie, unearthly silence. It will be some seconds before sound worms and shock waves reach the waiting Marines.

The Marines move toward the explosion which, because it cocurred close to the ground, is sucking up a solid column of dust. America's twenty-eighth atomic blast marks another step toward the use of the A-bomb as support for ground troops.
