

OLYMPICS REPORT

Here's the start of the 10-thousand metres, our first action pictures from Helsinki, and it's soon Zatopek, the Incredible Czech, out in front, leading Mimoun of France and Pirie of Britain. Zatopek broke the Olympic record for this race at Wembley four years ago and it looks any odds on him keeping his title.

The perfection of his machine-like running shows in slow motion. He always looks in agony and has a habit of hitting himself as he runs. Mimoun is keeping with him, but Pirie has dropped back as Zatopek laps a tail-end Charlie.

And here's the finish as the amazing Zatopek laps one after another to beat his own record by 42 seconds!

The trainer rushes across with eager congratulations and - ouch! - that's his foot. There's just time to see Davis of America set a new high jump record of 6-foot-8 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inches, and then it's the 100-metres final, which Macdonald Bailey reached after a photo-finish. And they're off! Mac is slow into his stride and they're fairly tearing it up!
