GUILD HIGHLIGHTS.

Processions

The Roman Catholic procession will be led by Cardinal Bernard Griffin, Archbishop of Canterbury, two other archbishops and five bishops. It is expected that 30,000 Roman Catholics will take part, with tableaux and banners, and wearing colourful dresses.

The Church of England procession will be a remarkable witness of faith, offering fine opportunities for pictures.

There will also be a Free Church Sunday Schools procession, and a procession of Friendly Societies, with ancient emblems, banners and regalia.

The Trades' and Industries' Procession will be three miles long, and there will be about 100 tableaux presented by trading and industrial firms, workers' organisations and individual firms. The tableaux will be on huge floats and some are costing thousands of pounds to stage. The entire procession will be a remarkable display of Preston's products and craftsmanship.

The Guild will conclude with a great Torchlight and Carnival Procession through the town. This will include elaborate tableaux and . fancy-dress.

Industrial Exhibition.

This will open on August 23rd, and continue for a fortnight. It will be partly in tented pavilions and partly in the open-air, and will cover nearly 200,000 square feet. It will be devoted entirely to the exhibits of firms within six miles of Preston. Viscount Swinton will open this exhibition.

Balls.

There will be elaborate Guild balls, and in a special ballroom erected in Miller Park there will be nightly dancing on a floor used by the Queen.

Children's Pageant.

Six thousand children will take part in a historical pageant in Avenham Park.

Merrie England.

A cast of 500 will give open-air presentations of Edward German's "Merrie England".

Overseas Visitors.

The Mayor will hold a special reception for visitors from overseas.

Royal Iancashire Agricultural Show.

The Royal Lancashire Agricultural Show has been specially delayed so that it can be held in Preston in Guild Week. It will be staged on Ashton Park.

Military Honour.

During the week Preston will honour its own Loyal Regiment by officially "adopting" it at a special ceremony.

Exhibitions.

Many exhibitions will be staged during the week: they will cover such varied subjects as Roman Catholic relics, technical education, astronomy (in the town's observatory), science, the town's charters, Guild rolls, veteran cor plate and regalia. ----

PRESTON GUILD - PRESS NOTICE

- GENERAL PRESS PASSES will be issued to reporters and photographers. These will give facilities at all street processions, ceremonial events and will be generally accepted at all Corporation or Corporationsponsored events.
- FACILITIES for reporters at street processions will include seats on the official stand and freedom to move about the line of route and at assembly points.
- FACILITIES for photographers will include places on a special Press Photographers' stand in the middle of the main street (Fishergate) along which the processions will pass, and also on two tower wagons to be parked at convenient points overlooking the procession routes. Photographers' passes will also permit free movement along the procession routes.
