Nove then 160 fighting ships of British, American and other NATO floots gather in the Firth of Forth before setting out to Northern European waters for an Atlantic Past operation called "Exercise Mainbrace." The battleship "Yanguard" is Britain's most powerful contribution to this eight-country exercise.
